Prayer, the solution to stress

Beloved and Holy People of God,

In today's fast-paced world, stress and worry can often overwhelm us, they are one of the great destroyers of our physical, emotional, and spiritual health. Our lives are filled with stress and worry, sometimes over quite small things, as well as the big issues we see and experience. We stress and worry about things in our personal lives we feel are out of our control, somehow hoping if we worry, we will gain some level of control. Stress and worry seem to be the acceptable response to our struggles or when we are short on hope things will change.

In the story of Abraham, found in Genesis 18:20-32, we see an example of how to prayer. Abraham is stressing and worried for the faithful people in Sodom and Gomorrah, as God is going to assess if the city should be destroyed due to their unfaithfulness. Abraham's response is prayer, asking if God will spare the city if there are as few as 10 faithful people, which God promises. Abraham prayed believing in the faithfulness of God, knowing God is faithful to God's promises.

This story about Abraham is the solution to our stressing and worrying: going to God with our worries and trusting that God will hear and respond. When we pray, we need to remind ourselves that if we try to tell God how to answer, we may be disappointed, because God's faithfulness includes answers that are best for us.

Similarly, Jesus teaches us about the importance of prayer in Luke 11:5-13. He says, "Ask, and you will receive; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened." Then He uses the example of a parent giving to their child what is best for them.

When we are stressed or worried, I believe our prayers should be to put the situation into God's hands, then ask for God to show us HOW to deal with the stress or WHAT we need to be doing. This prayer, like that of Abraham's, comes from a place of faith, trusting that God is present and knows what is best. We are also asking God to get us moving.

As William Barclay wisely noted, "Worry about the future is wasted effort, and the future reality is seldom as bad as the future of our fears."

Ultimately, by placing our worries in God's hands and seeking His guidance, we can find peace amidst life's uncertainties. Take your stress and worries to the Lord in prayer, trusting in God's loving presence and help.










To provide crisis shelter, victim-center advocacy and supportive services for victims of intimate partner violence.

NBWS provides emergency crisis shelter and advocacy to victim/survivors of intimate partner violence; this includes shelter services to women and their children and short-term safe housing to men and their children. Crisis shelter is temporary, short term housing. With the crisis shelter and safe housing services, NBWS provides emotional support, meals, items to meet basic needs (personal hygiene products and clothing), and transportation.


