

Sisters and Brothers in Christ. Message

Last fall, I wanted to learn more about sabbath rest, what it meant and looked like. I came upon a book written by an Old Testament theologian, Walter Brueggemann titled: "sabbath as resistance, Saying

NO to the CULTURE OF NOW." Brueggemann, in great detail, goes through the scriptures, laying out how and why sabbath rest was given as one of the commandments. It came from God having heard the cries of the Israelite slaves in Egypt, who had never experienced rest. Pharaoh, only making their lives more difficult, having no pity. Based on what had happened, God gave the third commandment, "Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy."

Sabbath means rest, a time to do nothing but rest from the busyness of life. Brueggemann reminds us that the world we live in bases a person's worth on how productive we are, at home and work. Whereas God says, we have been wonderfully created in the likeness and image of God—not what we do, but who God has created us to be, God's children.

For nearly 30 years, I took Saturday off to spend time with my family, not experiencing it as a sabbath, rest, and renewal. A few months back, someone approached me asking why I took Saturday off when it wouldn't be a day off if you were preparing for Sunday morning. They encouraged me to move my day off to Monday, and my reply was, "But I've never done it before." So, I tried it, and it was one of the best things I've done for myself in a long while. Here's why.

With a good amount of work, I've made Monday my sabbath—not my day off, but my sabbath. This means I don't do any work, no housework, no grocery shopping, but sleeping in, enjoying time with Kevin and our dog, taking a nap, maybe baking something I've wanted to try, and staying close to home, only doing things that give me joy and energy. Tuesday morning, I'm ready for the week, feeling refreshed, feeling I will make it through whatever comes my way.

If I could convince you to make one change, it would be to take a sabbath rest sometime every week. First, we must believe the words of God; we are wonderfully created in the likeness and image of God, and not someone based on how much we accomplish. It requires a plan, getting the household chores done, shopping done, and yard work completed, or being willing to agree that if it's not done before, it will wait another day. Make your sabbath a day where you only do things that bring joy and energy. "The Sabbath's object is to give mortals relaxation from continuous, unending toil and by refreshing their bodies with a regularly calculated system of remissions, to send them out

The meeting was called to order at 6:37 pm by Rick.

Approval of the May 21st, 2024 Meeting Agenda: Calli moved to approve the agenda; second by Fred; Motion carried. Approval of the April 16th, 2024 Meeting Minutes: Jon moved to approve the previous minutes; second by Sue; Motion carried.

Pastor's Update:

• Taking a vacation from June 17-24 • Attended Synod Assembly last weekend

Treasurer's Report: Sue Rosselet:

• In the black for April while still working towards even for the year. • Made first payment to Pathways for our summer day camp (\$500 taken from Youth and Education fund). • Income - Expenses for May are in the black thus far thru 1st payroll • YTD we are at a deficit but working to catch-up • Updated on benevolences for each month • Playground funds continue to increase • Report was accepted and filed

Old Business:

- Rick gave an update on the propane tank We have a new tank that has been leveled We now have an app that monitors the % level daily
- New Signage Moving forward, it is ordered, markers are out on the driveway Electric work will cost extra, but there is money from the donor to cover the costs Completion is expected in the next couple of months
- Sale of property to James Adams Legalities, naming, and Leer title have held up the proceedings Glen Lindseth is working on the legal aspects (non-profit designation, church name, and Sec. of State)

New Business:

Team Reports - we need to get members back involved in our team meetings

• Youth and Education o Funds are being secured for new playground equipment ■ We are ready to start ordering new equipment ■ Grant money may be available to purchase accessible playground equipment • We will continue to explore this option ■ We also discussed options for surface and equipment o Many different options have been discussed and we would like the council's input on how to proceed ■ There are many different options that we could pursue that would result in increasing levels of costs with the possibility of increased grant funding o We discussed options and different types of equipment, different footprints, and different costs for the options. o Council discussed creating some parameters to guide the Youth and Education Team going forward. o Calli moved that we keep all plans and ordering of equipment within the current funds raised (approx. \$10,000 plus what we have in the Youth and Education Fund (approx. - \$5,000) and that any grant money raised will be used to replace monies in the Youth and Education Fund; Graig seconded. Motion carried.

- o Request to purchase a subscription to CCLI (Christian Copyright Licensing International) for contemporary music and streaming \$163/year for subscription + \$86/year for streaming Sue moved to approve the funds for the new subscription; Fred seconded the motion. Motion carried.

- Stewardship and Outreach Stressed the need for more congregational involvement in this group
- o Mission Intent cards are being delivered o Upcoming Benevolences June Boys and Girls Club July Hope House
- Buildings and Grounds Sign and propane update. Highway clean-up went very well Trees need to be trimmed this summer.

The Service Group Needs a President


The New Salem Service Group is once again in search of a President/leader. This volunteer position is open to all women and men – perhaps there's a couple in the congregation that would like to take on this project?
