Approval of the September 16, 2025 Meeting Agenda:

Approval of the August 19, 2025 Meeting Minutes:

Financial Report:

Stewardship and Outreach: Fred and Pastor Terry

God's Work, Our Hands report; around 25 people, amazing work done by all. Pollinator garden, cemetery clean up, and soup potluck all went well. Thank you to all who helped!

Councils' role in welcoming weekly guests. Seeking commitment from council members to routinely greet visitors and welcome them to New Salem. Pastor Terry will help identify new families and visitors for us so we can introduce ourselves and visit with them.

Save the Date: November 16th is Commitment Sunday. Look for revamped processes and changes for this year.

<u>Building and Grounds</u>: Pr. Terry Future replacement of the roof. Current estimated cost is between \$75 – \$80k.

Current amount set aside each year is \$2,000 to Capital Improvement Fund. Council recognizes that our building is 20 years old and replacement costs are coming in anticipation for a roof replacement and other things.

Motion 1: Motion to establish an action plan, including education and other additional contributions, with a goal for the Capital Improvement Fund to reach \$100,000 over the next five years. Bob moved, Fred seconded, motion carried.

Motion 2: Motion to recommend an increase in the annual contribution to the Capital Improvement Fund from \$2,000 to \$4,000 beginning in 2026. Fred moved, Sonya seconded, motion carried. As this is a line item in the budget, this amount is subject to approval at the Annual Meeting in January.

Sidewalk Repair. Bob will continue to repair cracks and uneven spots on the sidewalk with concrete as needed.

This dedicated group sponsors events like an annual rummage sale and an annual craft sale. They also serve at funerals. Funds raised are dispersed back into the community.


