#### Salt and Light

#### Beloved and holy people of God,

This past week I spoke with our council about the next step in our growth and mission at New Salem. In so many ways we already share the love of Christ within our congregation and community—we are certainly not standing still. We should all be proud of the ways God is working through us. Yet we also need to keep having these conversations, so that our focus remains on Christ's call and command.

Jesus often used everyday images to describe the life of a disciple. In Matthew 5:14–16 he says, "You are the light of the world." Light is not meant to be hidden, but lifted high so that all may see and give glory to God. We are the light of the world, called to let Christ's light shine through us. Still, we must ask: are we doing all we can to let that light be seen?

When I look at the world around us, I see so much injustice and suffering. My heart aches at the violence, division, and inequality we witness every day. (As I just heard of the tragic shooting at Annunciation Catholic School, in Minneapolis) I often find myself asking: What can I do? What can we do, as Christ's people, to make a difference?

In Matthew 5:13, Jesus also says, "You are the salt of the earth." Just as salt brings out the flavor in food, we are called to bring hope, healing, and God's goodness into the world. The question is: how can we bring out the best in a world weighed down by so much pain?

One way is to come together in prayer. We can pray for hearts and minds to be changed, for those who work tirelessly on behalf of justice, and for God's healing presence among us. I invite you to join me in beginning a monthly evening gathering for prayer—both guided and silent. Together, we will lift our voices and trust that God hears our cries, and that through us, God's justice and peace may be restored.



#### Minutes of August 19, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm by Eric Medberry.

**Devotion** – Pastor Terry, September will be Fred.

Approval of the August 19, 2025 Meeting Agenda:

Nora moved to approve the agenda. Graig seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of the July 15, 2025 Meeting Minutes:

Nora moved to approve the previous minutes; Sonya seconded. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** Looking to take possible vacation in September, pending finding an available supply pastor. Talked about focusing on racial injustice within our community. Feeling a pull to work towards awareness or creating an action group. Emphasis on seeing these issues as *human* issues, not *political* issues.

Financial Report: July was a decent month. Nothing out of the ordinary, no concerns noted.

Annual audit was completed on August 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025 and will be presented at the September meeting. The report was accepted and filed.

#### **Old Business:**

Playground update: Youth and Education Team organized the installation of additional equipment including accessible swing and tether ball. Kids have played on it and are loving the new additions. Looking at the addition of a tire swing for next summer.

Parking lot update: Line painting is TBD, Glen Lindseth is overseeing this. Waiting on paving company to fix the low spots that are not draining properly.

Filling vacant position on council. Still seeking to fill position.

#### **New Business:**

Pre-buy propane through Bemidji Coop, we have a credit of \$1,192.45 on our account. We used 1560 gallons from June 2024 – June 2025. We have until August 27<sup>th</sup> to get the price of \$1.65 per gallon. Motion to buy 1,900 gallons at \$1.65 per gallon = \$3,135, minus our credit of \$1,192.45 for a total of \$1,942.55. Council authorizes Traci to write a check for this purchase. Sue moved to approve, and Nora seconded, motion carried.

Bell tower has not been working properly. Could be an issue with recent power outages. Will keep monitoring it.

#### **Team Reports**

<u>Worship and Music</u>: Sonya Bemidji Area Church Musicians concert was a success. Served 114 meals, big success, lots of compliments and appreciation from attendees.

<u>Stewardship and Outreach</u>: Nora Committee has not met yet this month. Stu is working on organizing a meeting day and time.

<u>Building and Grounds</u>: Pr. Terry Bob Wagner has begun filling in cracks and holes in the cement in front of the building. Parking lot update; see above.

<u>Youth and Education</u>: Calli/Eric Day Camp 2025 was a huge success! Pathways counselors were helpful and the kids had a great time with them. Kids kept busy with outside activities, inside crafts, worship, music, lots of play and fun. Had 17 kids total over the four days. Family night with worship, potluck and together packed 164 birthday bags.

Truck or Treat will be Saturday, October 25<sup>th</sup> from 2-5pm. More details to come.

Sunday school will continue after communion when children are present.

Next Meeting: Next meeting is Tuesday, September 16th at 6:30 pm. Teams will meet at 6 pm.

Adjournment/Lord's Prayer: Meeting adjourned at 7:20pm.



#### Mid-year review

Last year we provided emergency food support to 42,500 people in the community. By the end of this year, we expect to serve 47,000 people, an increase of 9%. With the recent cuts to federal, and expected reductions in state support, we expect that number to increase in 2026, cuts to SNAP having the largest expected impact on this growth.

## WE ARE AN EMERGENCY SHELTER FOR FAMILIES EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS.

We work with the families who seek shelter with us so much more beyond putting a roof over their heads. We work with them to identify and achieve their goals and dreams. We give them the tools and connections they need to move from homelessness into a home they can call their own.

#### **Emergency Shelter**

Village of Hope provides safe, secure emergency housing for families 24 hours/day ~ 7 days a week. We are open 365 days a year.

The environment that a family experiencing homeless comes into is very important. We work to create a calm, safe environment in which families can build a future.

Families can stay with us for 90 days, as long as they are actively looking for housing.

Each family has their own apartment. This preserves the family unit and provides privacy.

#### School Attendance

Because graduation is one factor in success, attending school is very important at Village of Hope. We work with the district 31 Homeless Liaison for transitions to help kids stay in their own school or get them registered if school is new. Keeping the routine of attending school is a goal that every family must achieve during their stay.

#### **Removing Barriers**

There is no "one size fits all" solution for homelessness. Every family has unique barriers and requires a intervention that fits. The case manager will begin this process by talking with the family and helping them set goals they want to achieve and looking at strengths and barriers to overcome. Then the networking starts! We work with many agencies and organizations to create the family future.

#### **Families**

What is our definition of family? Each family is unique and has their own composition. They do need to be looking to move into a house together. We have single moms with kids, single dads with kids, sisters raising kids together, grandparents raising kids and couples. Every combination possible!

#### **HOPE**

When families come to Village of Hope, they are at the lowest spot in their lives. They are exhausted and frustrated. They don't trust themselves or others. By working together, and building relationships, we start to rebuild their confidence and hope. We are so much more alike than different and pointing that out makes all the difference to a heartbroken family.


Yes, collection plates are still be passed during service!
